Submitting Project Proposals

- The application is available online at troynow.org. Complete the form to the best of your ability.
- After submitting the application, you may be contacted for more information.
- **What types of projects is the city looking for?**
 - Projects should **address the public health or economic impact** of the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - Projects should bring a **long-term, sustainable, positive impact** on the corresponding organization, neighborhood or community.
 - As this is a one-time revenue source, funds should be used for **capital investments** (buildings, real estate, equipment) rather than ongoing operating expenses.
 - While projects do not need to be submitted by a non-profit organization, it is extremely important that any funded projects can meet **reporting requirements**. Working with an established organization with experience administering programs is strongly encouraged.
